Friend Connection Game

Supplies

- felt (3 different colors of 81/2x11 pieces per child)
- rulers
- · permanent markers
- scissors
- card stock
- stapler

Easy Prep

• Make a sample craft to show kids.



Make a Version of Connect Four

Show kids the sample craft you made. Set out the supplies to share, and have kids follow these directions to make felt versions of Connect Four.

- Choose three different colors of felt. Pick one to be your background and two to be your playing pieces.
- Use a ruler to help you draw on your background felt a grid that's seven squares wide and six squares high. The squares should each be 1¼ inches.
- Cut the other two colors of felt into 1-inch squares, creating 21 of each color.
- Staple your background to a piece of card stock, trimming off any extra if you need to.

Play the Game

- Have kids form pairs and use one of their game boards to play Connect Four.
- First, kids will stand up the game board by propping it against a wall. Then they'll sit in front of it.
- One player will go first by placing a felt square of his or her color in any of the squares on the bottom row. (It will stick on its own.)
- The second player will add one of his or her squares. Players can't put a piece of felt in a square that's already filled in, and they can't have any empty squares below their piece in a column.
- The goal is to get four squares of your color in a row, vertically, horizontally, or diagonally.
- After kids play a game with a friend, have kids try to play the game by themselves.

Ask: • What was it like to play this game by yourself? with a friend?

• What are other games that are more fun to play with a friend?

Say: This game was pretty boring when you tried to play it all by yourself. But when you play with a friend, it's a lot of fun! There are a lot of things that are more fun to do with friends, and that's why it's great that <u>faithfulness</u> is a fruit of the <u>Spirit</u>. God gives us faithfulness so we can form long-lasting friendships with him and other people!

Have kids take their Friend Connection games home and show them to their friends and families as they share why faithful friends are so great.
